ORDER, DATED THE FIRST DAY OF DECEMBER, 1945, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF COMMERCE UNDER REGULATIONS 55 AND 55AA OF THE DEFENCE (GENERAL) REGULATIONS, 1939.

The Ministry of Commerce for Northern Ireland (in this Order referred to as "the Ministry") by virtue and in exercise of the powers under Regulations 55 and 55AA of the Defence (General) Regulations, 1939, delegated to it by the Minister of Fuel and Power, hereby orders as follows :—

1. The Coal Supply (Temporary Provisions) (Northern Ireland) Order, 1945 (a) is hereby amended as follows :—

The following sub-paragraph shall be substituted for sub-paragraph (a) of paragraph 1 :—

" 1. (a) During the month of December, 1945, the quantity of coal which may be furnished or acquired for consumption in any of the premises covered by the Principal Order shall not exceed the balance required to complete a total quantity of fifteen hundredweights in the period from the 1st day of October, 1945, to the 31st day of December, 1945, provided however that not more than one quarter ton shall be delivered in any one consignment. The provisions of this sub-paragraph shall not apply in respect of supplies to premises which are more than two miles from the merchant's last loading point and more than two miles outside the boundary of an urban district, nor to any consumer who is registered as a farmer, nor to premises which are not wholly or mainly used as a dwelling house."

2. This Order shall come into force on the 1st day of December, 1945.

3. This Order may be cited as the Coal Supply (Temporary Provisions) (Northern Ireland) (Amendment) (No. 8) Order, 1945.
