Housing Subsidy Order

ORDER, DATED 14TH DECEMBER 1973, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF DEVELOPMENT, WITH THE APPROVAL OF THE MINISTRY OF FINANCE, UNDER SECTION 1 OF THE HOUSING (NO. 2) ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1946.

The Ministry of Development (in this Order referred to as "the Ministry") with the approval of the Ministry of Finance, and on behalf of the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred on the Ministry by section 1 of the Housing (No. 2) Act (Northern Ireland) 1946(a), and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Housing Subsidy (Variation) (Renewal) (No. 6) Order (Northern Ireland) 1973 and shall be construed as one with the Housing Subsidy Order (Northern Ireland) 1962(b).

2. In its application to a housing scheme in respect of which the tender has been submitted for approval to the Ministry or accepted by the Northern Ireland Housing Executive or by a Housing Association after 15th June 1973 and before 16th September 1973 the Housing Subsidy Order (Northern Ireland) 1962 shall be amended by substituting for the Schedule contained therein the Schedule to this Order.

3. This Order shall come into effect on 16th December 1973.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport.)

This Order has the effect of keeping in operation the subsidy rates indicated in the Housing Subsidy (Variation) (No. 2) Order (Northern Ireland) 1973 which now ceases to have effect not having been confirmed by a Resolution of each House of Parliament within the statutory six months' period.

These revised rates of subsidy apply to houses for which tenders were accepted by the Executive or Housing Associations after 15th June 1973 and before 16th September 1973. The rates also apply to houses built by New Town Commissions by virtue of the New Towns Act (Northern Ireland) 1965.
