#### Contract of sale

# 3 Capacity to buy and sell.

- (1) Capacity to buy and sell is regulated by the general law concerning capacity to contract and to transfer and acquire property.
- (2) Where necessaries are sold and delivered [F1 to a minor or] to a person who by reason of [F2 mental incapacity or] drunkenness is incompetent to contract, he must pay a reasonable price for them.
- (3) In subsection (2) above "necessaries" means goods suitable to the condition in life of the [FI minor or other] person concerned and to his actual requirements at the time of the sale and delivery.
