OFFENCES RELATING TO FINANCIAL SERVICES

92 Penalties

- (1) A person guilty of an offence under this Part is liable—
 - (a) on summary conviction, to imprisonment for a term not exceeding the applicable maximum term or a fine not exceeding the statutory maximum, or both;
 - (b) on conviction on indictment, to imprisonment for a term not exceeding [F110 years] or a fine, or both.
- (2) For the purpose of subsection (1)(a) "the applicable maximum term" is—
 - (a) in England and Wales, [F2the general limit in a magistrates' court] (or 6 months, if the offence was committed before [F32 May 2022]);
 - (b) in Scotland, 12 months;
 - (c) in Northern Ireland, 6 months.
