Made - - - 11th December 1962 Coming into Operation 11th January 1963

- I, Reginald Edward, Baron Dilhorne, Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, with the concurrence of Hubert Lister, Baron Parker of Waddington, Lord Chief Justice of England, do hereby make the following Order in exercise of the powers conferred on me by section 57 of the Supreme Court of Judicature (Consolidation) Act 1925(a):—
- 1. There shall be assigned to the Chancery Division all proceedings in the High Court by way of petition, case stated or notice of motion under the enactments or regulations mentioned in the Schedule to this Order.
- 2. The Order made under section 57 of the Supreme Court of Judicature (Consolidation) Act 1925 on the 11th February 1950, which provided for matters theretofore heard by way of petition or case stated on the Revenue side of the King's Bench Division being heard before a Judge of the Chancery Division, is hereby revoked.
- 3. This Order may be cited as the Redistribution of Business (Revenue Paper) Order 1962 and shall come into operation on 11th January 1963.
