**1991 No. 771**

**The Motor Vehicles (International Circulation) (Amendment) Order 1991**

**Visitors' driving permits**

**2.** In Article 2 (visitors' driving permits) of the Motor Vehicles (International Circulation) Order 1975<sup>(1)</sup>—

- (a) in paragraph (1) after the words “a motor vehicle of any class” there shall be inserted the words “other than a large goods vehicle or a passenger-carrying vehicle”;
- (b) in paragraph (2) for the words “public service vehicle or heavy goods vehicle”, in each place where they occur, there shall be substituted the words “large goods vehicle or passenger-carrying vehicle” and for the words “either of such a licence as is required by section 22 of the Public Passenger Vehicles Act 1981<sup>(2)</sup>, or of such a licence as is required by section 110 of the said Act of 1988<sup>(3)</sup>” there shall be substituted the words “of a large goods vehicle driver’s licence or a passenger-carrying vehicle driver’s licence”;
- (c) in paragraph (3)(a) and (b) for the words “public service vehicle”, in each place where they occur, there shall be substituted the words “passenger-carrying vehicle” and for the words “such a licence as is required by section 22 of the Public Passenger Vehicles Act 1981” there shall be substituted the words “a passenger-carrying vehicle driver’s licence”; and
- (d) in paragraph (7) after the definition of “public service vehicle” there shall be inserted the following definition:—

“and “large goods vehicle”, “passenger-carrying vehicle”, “large goods vehicle driver’s licence” and “passenger-carrying vehicle driver’s licence” have the same meaning as in Part IV of the Road Traffic Act 1988”.
