**REPRESENTATION OF THE PEOPLE, NORTHERN
IRELAND**

**The Parliamentary Elections (Forms) (Northern Ireland)
Regulations 2015**

Made - - - - 11th February 2015

Coming into force in accordance with regulation 1(2)

In accordance with section 201(2) of the Representation of the People Act 1983(a), a draft of these Regulations has been laid before and approved by a resolution of each House of Parliament.

In accordance with section 7(1) and (2)(e) of the Political Parties, Elections and Referendums Act 2000(b), the Secretary of State has consulted with the Electoral Commission prior to these Regulations being made.

Accordingly, the Secretary of State makes the following Regulations in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 53(1)(c), 201(1) and (3) and 202(1) of, and rules 24(1)(c) and (3), 28(3) and (3A), and 32(3) of Schedule 1 to, the Representation of the People Act 1983(c) and section 15(5) of the Representation of the People Act 1985(d).

Citation, commencement, extent and interpretation

1.—(1) These Regulations may be cited as the Parliamentary Elections (Forms) (Northern Ireland) Regulations 2015.

(2) These Regulations come into force on the day after the day on which they are made.

(3) These Regulations extend to Northern Ireland only.

(4) In these Regulations, “the 2008 Regulations” means the Representation of the People (Northern Ireland) Regulations 2008(e).

Rule 28(3) was amended by paragraph 70 of Schedule 1 to the Electoral Administration Act 2006 (c. 22); rule 28(3A) was inserted by paragraph 14 of Schedule 1 to that Act and extended to Northern Ireland by S.I. 2014/1116.

Amendments relating to the declaration of identity

- 2.—(1) In regulation 71(b) of the 2008 Regulations, for the words “a local” substitute “another”.
- (2) In regulation 87 of the 2008 Regulations (procedure in relation to declarations of identity)—
- (a) in paragraph (1)(a), omit the words “and given his name and address”; and
 - (b) after paragraph (1) insert—
 - “(1A) A person must not sign the declaration as a witness under paragraph (1)(a) unless he is—
 - (a) aged 18 years or over; and
 - (b) satisfied to the best of his knowledge and belief as to the identity of the voter.”.

Amendment of Schedule 3 to the 2008 Regulations (Forms)

- 3.—(1) Schedule 3 to the 2008 Regulations (Forms) is amended as follows.
- (2) Replace Form A (elector’s official poll card) with the form in Schedule 1 to these Regulations.
- (3) Replace Form A1 (elector’s official postal poll card)(a) with the form in Schedule 2 to these Regulations.
- (4) Replace Form B (proxy’s official poll card) with the form in Schedule 3 to these Regulations.
- (5) Replace Form B1 (proxy’s official postal poll card)(b) with the form in Schedule 4 to these Regulations.
- (6) Replace Form E (proxy paper)(c) with the form in Schedule 5 to these Regulations.
- (7) Replace Form F (certificate of employment) with the form in Schedule 6 to these Regulations.
- (8) Replace Form L (declaration of identity)(d) with the form in Schedule 7 to these Regulations.
- (9) Replace Form M (declaration of identity (combined polls))(e) with the form in Schedule 8 to these Regulations.

- You can apply to vote by post. The deadline for completed applications is **5pm on [day] [date of deadline]**.
- If you are given a postal vote, you or the person you are proxy for will not be able to vote in person at this election.
- **To find out how to apply, please contact us.**

The person you are proxy for can vote themselves if they wish – but only if you have not already voted on their behalf.

You do not need to take either the poll card or this paper with you to vote but it will save time if you do take the poll card with you.
4. If you cannot vote in person at the polling station, contact the helpline or visit our website.
5. If you have been appointed as a proxy on behalf of an elector who has an anonymous entry in the register, you can only vote by post. If you have not already been granted a postal vote, you should contact the electoral registration officer.

Please read through carefully. If you need help, please contact us.

1. For your vote to be counted, you must fill in, in the presence of a witness, and return this declaration of identity with your ballot paper. You must do this even if you have already signed a similar declaration of identity for another election to be held on the same day.
2. Make sure you have filled in all the information on this declaration of identity and your witness has signed it.
3. Vote **only once** by putting a cross in the box next to your choice on the ballot paper.
4. Do not mark the ballot paper in any other way or your vote may not count.
5. Different colours are used for the ballot papers for each election. Each ballot paper has its own ballot paper envelope (the smaller envelope marked "A"), declaration of identity and covering envelope (the larger envelope marked "B"). The covering envelope and declaration of identity will refer to the colour of the ballot paper. It is important to use the correct envelopes and declaration of identity.
6. Place each ballot paper in the correct smaller envelope marked "A" and seal it. Then put the envelope marked "A", together with the correct declaration of identity, in the correct larger envelope marked "B" and seal it.
7. We must receive your postal vote in the envelope provided by **10pm on [day] [date of poll]**.
8. After receiving this postal vote, you cannot vote in person at a polling station in this election.

- Please contact us if you need information in another format or language.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations)

These Regulations amend the forms used at parliamentary elections held in Northern Ireland for poll cards, postal poll cards, proxy poll cards, proxy postal poll cards, declarations of identity, proxy papers and certificates of employment. These Regulations also remove the requirement for a witness to a declaration of identity to provide a name and address and define who may act as a witness.

An impact assessment has not been produced for this instrument as no impact on the private or voluntary sectors is foreseen.
