THE AGRICULTURAL PRODUCE (GRADING AND MARKING) (PERRY) REGULATIONS, 1935, DATED MAY 8, 1935, MADE BY THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES AS TO A GRADE DESIGNATION AND A GRADE DESIGNA-TION MARK FOR PERRY.

In exercise of the powers conferred on him by the Agricultural Produce (Grading and Marking) Acts, 1928 and 1931, the Minister of Agriculture 21 & 22 Geo. and Fisheries hereby makes the following Regulations:—

Prescription of grade designations.

1. The grade designation to indicate the quality of perry produced from perry pears grown in England and Wales shall be as follows:—

SELECT PERRY

and the quality indicated by such grade designation shall be deemed to be as described in the First Schedule hereto.

The grade designation mark shall be the grade designation specified Prescription in regulation 1 above, associated with the words "Empire Buying Begins of grade at Home" and with the following mark, namely, a map of England and designation Wales in silhouette with the words "Produce of England and Wales" marks. inscribed in a circle placed centrally in the map within which circle is a design representing the Union Jack and which is more particularly described in the Second Schedule hereto.

These Regulations shall come into operation on the 8th May, Date of 1935.

4. These Regulations may be cited as the Agricultural Produce Short title. (Grading and Marking) (Perry) Regulations, 1935.

SCHEDULE I

PERRY MADE FROM PEARS GROWN IN ENGLAND AND WALES: DEFINITIONS OF QUALITY OF SELECT PERRY GRADE

General Characteristics

Special Characteristics

The perry shall be produced from clean and reasonably sound perry pears only; no other fruit, juice of other fruit, and/or concentrated pear juice shall be used; no foreign acids shall be permitted, no sweetening substances shall be used other than pure beet or pure cane sugar; acetic acid shall not be present in such quantity that it is discernible to the palate; and the total volatile organic acids, not including carbonic acid, present shall not exceed 0.20 per cent. expressed as acetic acid; the perry shall be free from artificial bouquets and essences, and from preservatives and/or artificial colouring agents prohibited by the Public Health (Preservatives, etc. in Food) Regulations in force for the time being; the perry shall be free from disorders such as ropiness and sickness, reasonably clear, and reasonably free from floating matter and/or deposit.

To the pure, i.e., undiluted juice or battery diffusion juice of similar gravity, may be added not more than 25 per cent. of its own volume of a syrup made from pure cane or pure beet sugar (the syrup or its constituents may be added at any stage of manufacture). The original gravity of the finished product, whether pure juice perry or a perry to which syrup has been added, shall not be less than 1.040 at a temperature of 60° F.
