Prohibition of Importation and Keeping

THE GREY SQUIRRELS (PROHIBITION OF IMPORTATION AND KEEPING) ORDER, 1937, DATED MAY 6, 1937, MADE BY THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES AND THE SECRETARY OF STATE FOR SCOTLAND UNDER SECTION 10 OF THE DESTRUCTIVE IMPORTED ANIMALS ACT, 1932 (22 & 23 Geo. 5. C. 12).

In exercise of the powers vested in them by Section 10 of the Destructive Imported Animals Act, 1932, the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries and the Secretary of State for Scotland acting jointly hereby make the following Order:

- **1.** The importation into and keeping within Great Britain of any animal of the species designated *Sciurus carolinensis* and commonly known as the grey squirrel is prohibited.
- 2. This Order shall come into force on the thirty-first day of July, 1937.
- 3. This Order may be cited as The Grey Squirrels (Prohibition of Importation and Keeping) Order, 1937.
