**The A470 Trunk Road (Cemmaes
and Cwm Llinau, Powys)
(Temporary Prohibition of Vehicles)
Order 2023**

Made 24 October 2023

Coming into force 30 October 2023

The Welsh Ministers, as traffic authority for the A470 trunk road, are satisfied that traffic on specified lengths of the trunk road should be prohibited because of works proposed on or near the road.

The Welsh Ministers, therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by section 14(1) and (4) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(1), make this Order.

Title and commencement

1. The title of this Order is the A470 Trunk Road (Cemmaes and Cwm Llinau, Powys) (Temporary Prohibition of Vehicles) Order 2023 and this Order comes into force on 30 October 2023.

Interpretation

2. In this Order—

“exempted vehicle” (“*cerbyd esempt*”) means any vehicle being used by the emergency services, winter maintenance service vehicles or vehicles being used in connection with the works giving rise to this Order;

By virtue of S.I. 1999/672, and section 162 of, and paragraph 30 of Schedule 11 to, the Government of Wales Act 2006 (c. 32), these functions are now exercisable by the Welsh Ministers in relation to Wales.

“the trunk road” (“*y gefnffordd*”) means the A470 Cemmaes Road to Mallwyd trunk road;

“works period” (“*cyfnod y gwaith*”) means intermittent periods commencing at 19:00 hours on 30 October 2023 and ending when the temporary traffic signs for each period of works are permanently removed.

Prohibition

3. No person may, during the works period, drive any vehicle, other than an exempted vehicle, on:

- (i) the length of the trunk road at Cemmaes, Powys that extends from the permanent 40 mph speed limit terminus sign at the southern end of the village to the permanent 40 mph speed limit terminus sign at the northern end of the village;
- (ii) the length of the trunk road at Cwm Llinau, Powys that extends from a point 200 metres south of the permanent 40 mph speed limit terminus sign at the southern end of the village to the permanent 40 mph speed limit terminus sign at the northern end of the village.

Application

4. The prohibition in article 3 applies only during such times and to such extent as indicated by traffic signs.

Duration of this Order

5. The maximum duration of this Order is 18 months.
