## WAGES COUNCILS

**Boot and Shoe Repairing Wages Regulation (Amendment) Order  
(Northern Ireland) 1976**

*Made* . . . . . 4th June 1976

*Coming into operation* . . . . . 22nd June 1976

The Department of Manpower Services, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Section 10 of the Wages Councils Act (Northern Ireland) 1945(a), and now vested in it(b) hereby makes the following Order to give effect to wages regulation proposals received from the Boot and Shoe Repairing Wages Council (Northern Ireland):—

*Citation*

1. This Order may be cited as the Boot and Shoe Repairing Wages Regulation (Amendment) Order (Northern Ireland) 1976.

*Commencement*

2. The Wages regulation proposals set out in the Schedule shall come into operation on the specified date.

*Interpretation*

3. In this Order the expression “the specified date” means the 22nd day of June 1976, provided that where, as respects any worker who is paid wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, that date does not correspond with the beginning of the period for which the wages are paid; the expression “the specified date” means, as respects that worker, the beginning of the next such period following that date.

## SCHEDULE

## Statutory Minimum Remuneration

The Boot and Shoe Repairing Wages Regulation Order (Northern Ireland) 1970(c) (Order N.I.B.S. (110)) as amended by the Boot and Shoe Repairing Wages Regulation (Amendment) Order (Northern Ireland) 1975(d) (Order N.I.B.S. (125)) shall have effect as if in the Schedule thereto there was inserted, before paragraph 1, the following paragraph:—

Paragraph 1A.

*"ATTACK ON INFLATION" SUPPLEMENT*

*In addition to the remuneration specified elsewhere there shall be paid a supplement entitled "Attack on Inflation" Supplement as follows:—*

(i) *All workers other than those specified in paragraphs 3 and 4 .. .. .*

## EXPLANATORY NOTE

*(This Note is not part of the Order but is intended to indicate its general purport.)*

This Order which comes into operation on 22nd June 1976 amends the Boot and Shoe Repairing Wages Regulation Order (Northern Ireland) 1970 (Order N.I.B.S. (110)) as amended by the Boot and Shoe Repairing Wages Regulation (Amendment) Order (Northern Ireland) 1975 (Order N.I.B.S. (125)) by increasing the statutory minimum remuneration fixed by those Orders.

New provisions in the Schedule are printed in italics.
