The Superannuation Schemes (War Service) (End of Emergency) Order, 1949

1949 No. 1053

Made - - - 31st May. 1949

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 31st day of May, 1949

Present,

The King's Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Whereas by section one of the Superannuation Schemes (War Service) Act. 1940(a), it is provided that the expression "period of the present emergency" means the period beginning with the date of the commencement of the Military Training Act, 1939(b), and ending on such day as His Majesty

may by Order in Council declare to be the date on which the emergency that was the occasion of the passing of the first-mentioned Act came to an end:

Now, therefore, His Majesty in pursuance of the said section is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

- 1. It is hereby declared that the thirtieth day of May, nineteen hundred and forty-nine, is the date on which the emergency that was the occasion of the passing of the Superannuation Schemes (War Service) Act, 1940, came to an end.
- 2. This Order may be cited as the Superannuation Schemes (War Service) (End of Emergency) Order, 1949.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport.)

The Superannuation Schemes (War Service) Act, 1940, enabled provision to be made for preventing loss of benefits under certain superannuation schemes being suffered by persons undertaking service in the armed forces or employment for war purposes during the period of the present emergency. Although this period will have come to an end on the thirtieth May, 1949, by virtue of the Order, the Act will continue to apply to persons undertaking compulsory national service after that date: (see section 1 (6) of the Superannuation (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act, 1948(a)).
