NATIONAL HEALTH SERVICE, SCOTLAND

The National Health Service (General Medical and Pharmaceutical Services) (Scotland) Amendment Regulations 1966

<i>Made</i> - - -	20th December 1966
<i>Laid before Parliament</i>	30th December 1966
<i>Coming into Operation</i>	1st January 1967

In exercise of the powers conferred on me by sections 34 and 40 of the National Health Service (Scotland) Act 1947(a), as amended (b), and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, I hereby make the following regulations:—

1.—(1) These regulations may be cited as the National Health Service (General Medical and Pharmaceutical Services) (Scotland) Amendment Regulations 1966 and shall come into operation on 1st January 1967.

(2) The Interpretation Act 1889(c) applies for the interpretation of these regulations as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

2. The National Health Service (General Medical and Pharmaceutical Services) (Scotland) Regulations 1966(d) shall be amended as follows—

(1) In paragraph 10(1) of Part I of Schedule 1 (which paragraph provides for the demand or acceptance of fees by practitioners) there shall be deleted in item (f) the words “before 1st January 1967”.

(2) In Part I of Schedule 3 (which Part specifies the appliances which may be supplied to persons receiving general medical services)—

(a) at the end of both items “Hypodermic needles” and “Hypodermic syringes” there shall be inserted in each case the words “as specified in the Drug Tariff”;

(b) after the item “Hypodermic syringes” there shall be added an additional item “Hypodermic syringes—spirit-proof cases, as specified in the Drug Tariff”;

(c) for the item “Protectives” and the types listed thereunder there shall be substituted the following item and types—

“Protectives:

jaconet

oiled rayon

oiled silk

polythene gloves, as specified in the Drug Tariff

polythene occlusive dressings, as specified in the Drug Tariff”.

3.—(1) The National Health Service (General Medical and Pharmaceutical Services) (Scotland) Amendment Regulations 1964(a) are hereby revoked.

(2) Section 38 of the Interpretation Act 1889 shall apply as if these regulations were an Act of Parliament and as if the regulations revoked by these regulations were an Act of Parliament repealed by an Act of Parliament.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Regulations.)

These regulations amend the National Health Service (General Medical and Pharmaceutical Services) (Scotland) Regulations 1966 by providing that medical practitioners may continue after 1st January 1967 to accept a fee for administering an anaesthetic to a person undergoing denture treatment and by making minor changes to the list of appliances which may be supplied to persons receiving general medical services.
